6. Rationale Supporting Use of Citation in No. 5.

Antaika China Metal Market Monthly English language reports provide unique data sets on China's metal markets not readily available elsewhere, including price series and market intelligence on a broad range of metal commodities. Much of the data incorporated into Antaika data series are not readily available outside of China and some may only be available in Chinese. Much of the market data supplied by Antaika is uniquely developed by Antaika through direct industry contacts, established relationships with Chinese government agencies, and direct survey of company data. Antaika also provides unique market analyses based on their compiled data sets and direct market observations. As a China-based company with more than 150 analysts, they are also able to provide information in a more timely manner to that available through official or other channels. China has become the leading world market for these mineral commodities and a comprehensive understanding is important to the National Minerals Information Centers (NMIC) mission of assuring an adequate supply of minerals to the U.S. economy. Antaika data and news features on minor or specialty metals are especially important as China is the leading global supplier of several of these materials, many of which are used in electronic applications, and scarcity of supply has become a growing concern given global competition for raw materials and their unique role in renewable energy production.

- The information in Antaika reports enhances mineral commodity specialists' understanding of issues and activities in the metals industry and is regularly cited in USGS publications. As they cover more in-depth information and collectively a broader range of materials than other industry publications, these publications are used by most of the commodity specialists responsible for nonfuel metals.
- It is important for mineral commodity specialists to have up-to-date information provided electronically in Antaika reports in order for them to be responsive to issues that arise within their respective industries.
- The subscription helps mineral commodity specialists gather valuable information, enhancing their expertise in their role as principal USGS contact point for the mineral commodities to which they are assigned, and in reporting on important industry developments through monthly, quarterly, and annual USGS publications.
