

AN OVERVIEW OF SAC STATE

California State University, Sacramento is the seventh-largest university in the 23-campus CSU system, enrolling a multicultural student body of 29,000. Quality teaching is a top priority, and our classes are small and personalized. Preparing students for a career is a vital part of the education we offer. Thousands of students from all majors earn academic credit working internship and co-op positions, many of which are paid. Sacramento State was founded as Sacramento State College in 1947 during a time of intense demand for higher education after World War II. We moved to our permanent location on the banks of the historic American River in 1953. In 1972 we were renamed California State University, Sacramento. Today, our 300-acre campus is sheltered by more than 3,000 trees and dotted with flower gardens. We have about 3 million square feet of building space. Miles of trails stretch along the nearby river parkway, linking the University and student housing with recreational areas such as Folsom Lake and Old Sacramento. We're building to accommodate a fast-growing student body. Recent additions include the Eli and Edythe Broad Fieldhouse, the Hornet Bookstore, the American River Courtyard Residence Hall and the Recreation and Wellness Center. The University's Alex G. Spanos Sports Complex was upgraded to host the 2000 U.S. Olympic Track and Field Trials, and hosted the event again in 2004. DIRECTIONS TO THE CAMPUS

Eastbound Highway 50: Exit at Power Inn/Howe Avenue. Go under the freeway onto Hornet Drive. Turn left onto College Town Drive. The road becomes State University Drive South and you are on the south end of campus.

Westbound Highway 50: Exit at Howe Avenue. Continue through the light onto College Town Drive. At the second light the road becomes State University Drive South and you are on the south end of campus.

Westbound Business 80: Exit at J Street. Turn left onto J Street and continue approximately 4 miles. Turn right onto Carlson/Esplanade. This is the north end of campus.
